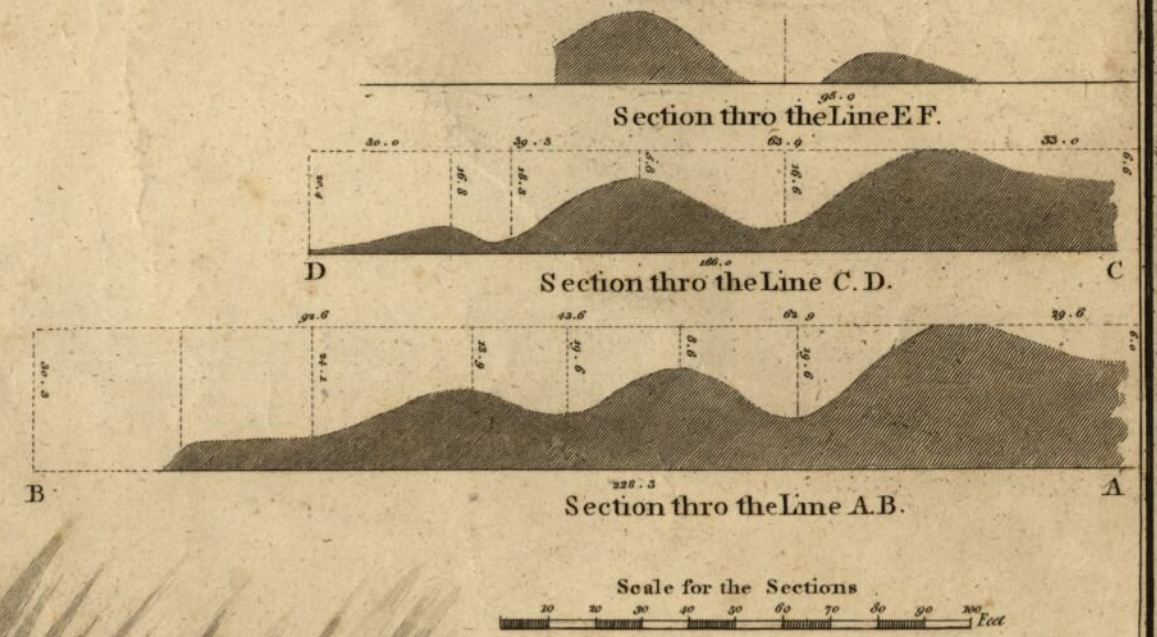




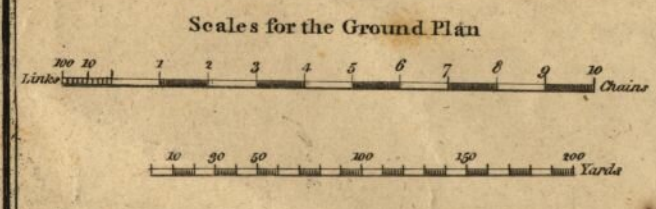
Alteration of the ROAD from Bromley to Westerham near Hollwood
 The distance by the New Road, measuring from a Bridge, or Gutter Arch at
 the northwest corner of Hollwood Wood, southward to a Gate of a Field
 where the Road from Keston Church to Down crosses the Westerham Road,
 and near to where the new Road enters again the old one, is 945 Links of Gunter's Chain
 The distance by the Old Road from and to the above
 mentioned points is 8500 Links
 Difference (being 36 Feet less than a Furlong) 945 Links



CÆSAR'S CAMP at Hollwood in the County of Kent, about 14 miles Southeast from London.
 Occupies very high Ground, commanding extensive prospects on the Northeast, and South sides; the
 Intrinchments have been cut with great labour in a hard gravelly Soil, and therefore those on the
 West & North sides remain to this day in good preservation. The CAMP within the inner Bank, and
 Dotted Line on the South side, contains Forty two Acres and Twenty Poles.

- A B and C D, are the Places where the Sections were taken; they are laid down by a large Scale, and
 the different dimensions marked in Feet and Inches.
- E is a breach that has been made thro' the Intrinchments, for the Road from Bromley to Hollwood House to pass thro'
- F Apparently has been one of the Gateways, because the Intrinchments have not been carried through.
- G a Spring called RAVENS BOURN, and is the Head of the River of that name.
- H Probably has been another Gateway, and is at present the Road from Hollwood to Hays.
- I A Breach lately made, to give access to & from M. Pitt's Farm Yard.
- K from I to K has been levelled down within these few Years.
- K to L has been defaced for many Years.
- M A Hollow part may have been one of the Gateways, the Pond of Water has been lately dug out.
