THE Possessor of this Collection having been sent to Portugal, in early youth, with an intention of his being a permanent resident at Lisbon, acquired a knowledge of the language, and became acquainted with the works of some of the authors of that country. The unpleasant aspect of affairs, however, from the meditated invasion by France, which was afterwards made, altered his views in life, and he returned to England. At that time the literature of Portugal was little known, and access to books could only be had through the kindness of a few individuals, or, by obtaining their perusal in the public libraries.

Although obliged to quit the country, he retained a wish to prosecute his studies, and was much indebted for the facilities which were afforded him, particularly at Buckingham House, by his Majesty's Librarian, and by Mr. Southey, Mr. Heber, and Mr. Gooden, who kindly assisted him.

The Publication of the Translation of the Play of Dona Ignez de Castro, and of the Memoirs of the Life and Writ-

ings of Camoens, together with the Formation of the present Collection, were the consequences of this visit to Portugal. The acquiring the Collection has been a source of pleasure for more than twenty-five years, and it could only have been made by great diligence, and by having agents in Lisbon, who secured copies of the rarer works as they chanced to offer for sale.

The following pages will serve as a Catalogue to any person, who may afterwards become the possessor of the Collection ; whilst it may also be valuable to the Bibliographer, by giving him data as to the early editions of the works, and sketches in several instances of the lives of their authors.

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

This person, justly celebrated in the annals of literature, was born at Evora, in 1498, and descended from noble families. He early adopted the religious profession, and was sent to Salamanca to study, from whence he went to Paris and Brussels; and on the death of his mother returned to Evora, in 1534. This event so overwhelmed him, he determined to leave his country for ever: this was, however, prevented by Joaõ IV., who not choosing that Portugal should be deprived of so extraordinary a genius, appointed him master to his brothers, the Infantes D. Affonso, D. Henrique, and D. Duarte. Finding that the duties dependent upon this office would not accord with his monastic duties, he obtained the Pope's permission to change his monkish habit for that of a priest. After this he lived 33 years, and, although separated from the convent, he strictly adhered to the discipline.

This author was born in 1590; his early youth evinced extraordi-

nary genius in various departments of literature. He studied at Braga, and became at first secretary to his relation the Bishop of Oporto. He went to Spain, having been invited by the Secretary of State of the Kings Philip III. and IV. On their deaths his hope of advancement vanished, and he returned to Lisbon in 1628. He afterwards accompanied the Marquis Castello-Rodrigo, the ambassador to Rome, and was received in a very flattering manner by the Pope. He then came to Madrid, and had a pension settled upon him for the support of his family. He dedicated the last fifteen years of his life to composing the History of the Political and Military Actions of the Portuguese in the Four Quarters of the Globe, and died in 1649. He is celebrated as the commentator of the works of Camoens, was himself a poet, and left behind him numerous works.

This is the second edition which was improved by the additions of the Father D. Jose Barbosa. Amongst other matters is an account of the Coins of Portugal, with plates. The work is divided into eight discourses, and treats of the archaeology of the country generally. The first edition appeared at Lisbon 1655.

This celebrated antiquary was born in Lisbon. When a youth he lived with his uncle a Canon of the Cathedral of Evora, and studied at the University there. He early distinguished himself, and became the possessor of a most curious library, much celebrated at the time for the rare works it contained, and which he generously opened to the public, as well as his museum of statues and coins. It is to him we are indebted for the portrait of Camoens, of which poet he composed a life, in which the portrait appeared, having been obtained by his nephew Gaspar.

The second edition bears date 1576, from the same press, three years after which these commentaries were translated into French.

This volume is dedicated to Sir Francis Drake, Knt., and is very rare. At the Whiteknight's sale it brought 1*l.* 18*s.*; and in Thorpe's Catalogue, 1826, it is marked 5*l.* 5*s.* The translator was Nicholas Litchfield.

Castaneda was a native of Santarem, and, in his youth (1528), emigrating to India, began, on his arrival at Goa, his history, which occupied him twenty years. It commences with the discovery of India, and brings the account up to the time of D. Joao de Castro. He died at Coimbra in 1559. He was the first historian of India, and his works are most rare. His first publication was "Historia do Descobrimento e Conquista da India pelos Portuguezes," with the following colophon:—"Foy impresso este primeiro livro da Historia da India em a muito nobre, e leal cidade de Coimbra, por Johaõ de Barreyra, e Johaõ Alvares, Impressores del Rey, na mesma Universidade; acabouse aos seis dias do mez de Marco de M.D.L.I."

It consists of 267 pages, and is dedicated to the King D. Joao III. Three years afterwards (1554) a new edition of this book, with a different dedication and amendments, was published in folio at Coimbra. The transactions of fifty years are detailed in it, and a special license was obtained from the King as to the copyright, on account of the expenses, and the author having spent twenty years on the work. Vol. II. and III. were published at Coimbra, 1552—Vol. IV. and V., 1553—Vol. VI. and VII., 1554—Vol. VIII., 1561, was published after the author's death by his children, and dedicated to the King Dom Sebastiaõ. Castaneda's history* was translated into Italian by Affonso de Ulhoa, and published at Venice in 4to., 1578, 2 vols., printed by Ziletti, with Aldine type. The first volume was translated into French by Nicholas de Grouchy. Paris, 1553, 4to. (see next article), also into Spanish, Anveres, 1554. 8vo.

This volume has a beautifully engraved title page ; the second title runs—" Quarta Decada da Asia de Joaō de Barros dedicada a El Rei Dom Philippe II. Nossa Senhor, reformada, accrescentada, e Illustrada com Notas e Taboas Geographicas por Joaō Baptista Lavanha."

This Decade, which was left imperfect by Joaō de Barros, was preserved by his daughter-in-law, Luiza Soares, the widow of his eldest son, and was purchased from her by Philip I., who gave her 500,000 Rs. It was first placed in the hands of D. Fernando de Castro, a Fidalgo of great talent, and afterwards in those of Duarte

Nunes de Leaõ. Neither of them carrying the King's intentions into effect, it was given to Lavanha, who, at the desire of Philip II., undertook to finish it. He was "Cosmografo Môr do Reino," and not only finished and arranged the work, but also illustrated it with notes and Geographical Tables. For some further account see De Bure, No. 5611.

Joaõ de Barros was born of good family in 1496. He received his first instruction in the palace of the King D. Manoel, where, at that time, the young fidalgos were accustomed to be taught. Having greatly distinguished himself, when a youth, he was appointed by Manoel Keeper of the wardrobe of his son the Prince D. Joaõ. It was during this time that he composed his romance of the History of the Emperor Clarimundo. At the age of twenty, he was honoured by the king's commands to narrate the heroic achievements of the Portuguese in the East. On the accession of Joaõ III. he was appointed Captain of St. Jorge de Mina in Africa, and afterwards first Treasurer, and then Commissioner of the House of India and the Dependencies, situations which occupied most of his time. He was now asked to write the History of India, which he had begun under the reign of Manoel, and which he consented to do, deeming it a high honour. At the end of eleven years he published the three Decades, which were honourably received, and justly so, considering the perseverance with which he had consulted the native annals, dispatches from India, &c. He now relinquished his office, and received a pension from D. Sebastiaõ, who appointed him a Fidalgo of the Palace. He retired to his Quinta, near Pombal, where he died in 1570, aged 74 years.

Diogo de Couta was born in Lisbon in 1542. From his earliest youth he shewed such symptoms of genius, that at the age of 10 he entered into the service of Infante D. Luiz, who, observing his qualifications, sent him to study in the college of the Jesuits. Here he learnt Latin and Rhetoric. His patron seeing the progress he made, sent him, along with his own son, to hear Lectures on Philosophy in the Convent of Bemfica. The death of D. Luiz dispelled the hopes he had entertained of preferment, and he thought of being a soldier, for which profession he had early predilections. He accordingly set out for India in 1556, where for ten years he particularly distinguished himself; at the end of this period he visited his native country, and having been rewarded as he deserved, he returned to Goa. His life at Goa being one of ease, he after betook himself to his studies, and wrote various poems in Latin and Italian, also commentaries on two poems of his friend Luis de Camões. On the accession of Philip the Prudent to the throne of Portugal, it was thought proper, that the History of India left unfinished by Joaõ de Barros, then esteemed, the Portuguese Livy, should be continued. Diogo de Conto was, from his well-known abilities, selected for this office, and received the commission, accompanied by the title of Chronista Mór da India. The duties imposed upon him were honourably fulfilled, and the work above-mentioned was produced, and he was appointed, in consequence, Guarda Mór da Torre do Tombo do Estado da India. He died at Goa in 1616, aged 74. His life has been written by the learned antiquary Manoel Severim de Faria. He left several works in MS., some of which were published after his death.

The above volume is the first edition, and is rare. It was undertaken by order of the King, Philip the Second of Spain and First of Portugal, and contains the Chronicles from Dom Henrique, the founder of the kingdom, until the death of Dom Fernando, 1090 to 1383.

Garcia de Resende was a native of Evora, and was the brother of Andre de Resende, whom we have before noticed.

He was page to the King Dom Joao II. and Fidalgo of his house, and having every opportunity of studying the character of that Monarch, he was fully qualified to write his life. He accompanied Tristaõ da Cunha, in 1514, as Secretary of Embassy to Pope Leo X., from the King Dom Manoel. He superintended the publication of the "Cancionero Geral."

Galvaõ was a native of Evora. His father was secretary to the Kings Joao I. and Affonso V. After being properly educated, he was appointed to succeed Fernaõ Lopez as the Royal Historiographer, and became Secretary to Joao II. He was afterwards, successively, Ambassador to Pope Alexander VI., the Emperor Maximilian, and the King of France. In April, 1535, he set out on an embassy to Ethiopia, to return a similar compliment to the Queen, who had dispatched an Ambassador with various splendid gifts to Manoel in the name of her son ; he died, however, in 1537, without having fully accomplished the wishes of his Sovereign. He had received the orders of Manoel, to remodel for publication, the Old Chron-

icles, and this appears the only one which has survived. It was afterwards published in folio, Lisbon 1726, having been faithfully copied from the original, preserved in the Royal Archives of the Torre do Tombo, by Miguel Lopez Ferreira. The title "Chronica do muito alto, e muito esclarecido Principe, D. Affonso Henriquez, primeiro Rey de Portugal."

EL REY DOM PEDRO I.

The first edition was published in folio, at Lisbon in 1567, and another in 8vo., at Lisbon, in 1724.

Born in 1501, he was appointed at an early age, Keeper of the Robes, and Chamberlain to the King Dom Manoel. He visited most of the European Courts and cities. Joaō III. being aware of his abilities, sent him as Minister to treat with the Kings of Poland, Denmark, and Sweden, which negotiations were completed by him most satisfactorily. His genius, and particularly his thorough knowledge of the Latin language, procured him the friendship of many Princes, amongst whom was Henry VIII., of England,

whilst the most eminent professors of Science of the time were his intimates and associates. In consequence of the services he had rendered his country, he was appointed Guarda Mór da Torre do Tombo, and Chronista Mór do Reino. He arranged in order the public papers and documents, and wrote the Chronicle of the King D. Manoel, in 1558. He was skilled in the languages of Europe, knew Arabic, and was an excellent musician. He died in 1560. He was the author of many works, a list of which is given by Machado in the *Biblioteca Lusitana*.

Joze Pereira Bayam, who compiled it from various memoirs. In the following work Bayaō admits that the work was attributed to Menezes. Machado writes that it was falsely so, and enumerates it amongst the works of Bayam, of whom he gives a high character for his historical knowledge.

It has been considered that it would not be unacceptable, if, previous to commencing the Catalogue of Books relating to Camoens, in this, it may be said, unrivalled Collection, the following tables were given, shewing at one view a list of the editions of the works of this poet, which have been hitherto described or noticed by bibliographers; and of the translations into the languages of foreign countries of the poem, which has rendered its author's name so justly celebrated.

It has been the object of the Collector to make the list correct. It is not, however, improbable, that editions may exist which have hitherto escaped notice. Not

many years ago, Mr. Heber obtained an edition, now in this collection, which had not before been described; and, what is very extraordinary, in the same year that this copy came into the possession of the present proprietor, at the sale of Mr. Heber's books, he purchased two other copies of the same edition, one of which belonged to the late Stephen Weston, Esq., and the other to Lord Guilford.

The asterisk, in the margin of the table, shews which of the editions and translations are in this collection; and the notes opposite those, which are not so marked, explain either where they are described, or as to doubts being entertained of their existence.

A full account of the editions of the works, and translations of the Lusiad is given in the Memoirs of the Life and Writings of Camoens, published in 1820.

This collection boasts the possession of the TWO EDITIONS of the Lusiad, published in 1572, both, but more especially the first printed, being of THE UTMOST RARITY. The first is distinguished by the last two lines in the first stanza, being printed thus :—

“ Entre gente remota edificaram
“ Novo Reino, que tanto sublimaram.”

whilst in the second, the same lines appear—

“ E entre gente remota edificaraō
“ Novo Reino, que tanto sublimaraō.

The title is within a border, formed of wood cuts, having two pillars resting upon a base, at the top, a pelican in the centre, feeding its young, and with a dolphin on each side. Here again the editions may be known, by the pelican looking in the first to the right, and in the second to the left, viewed from the front. Other

wood cuts have also evidently been used in forming the border of the second, which bear a close resemblance to the first, but are copies, and, in some instances, reversed. This, instead of encouraging the idea, that the second was a corrected copy, published under the eye of the author, would rather lead to a conclusion that it was not so, but had been surreptitiously published. It is difficult to account for other wood cuts being used, if the two works were published by the same printer, as stated in the title, and under the same superintendence. This circumstance does not appear to have been noticed by authors who have written respecting these two editions, some of whom are inclined to think that the second was published by Camoens to correct mistakes which appeared in the first. The curious will find interesting speculations as to these editions in the account given by Dom Joze Maria de Souza-Botelho, in his splendid edition of the Lusiad, and in a letter to the Royal Academy of Sciences at Lisbon, "Sur le Texte des Lusiades", published in March, 1826, by Mons. Mablin, under-librarian of the University of France.

The license of the King, Dom Sebastiaõ, dated Lisbon, the 24th September, 1571, states, that he was pleased to give his license to Luis de Camoens, to print in the city of Lisbon, a work, in octavo rima, named Os Lusiadas, containing ten entire cantos, and in which are related the principal deeds of the Portugese in India since the voyage for its disovery, undertaken by order of his grandfather, King Dom Manoel. This grant of copyright is extended by a clause in the ordinance, to any further cantos of the Lusiad, which Camoens might print.

The copy of the first edition was brought from Spain in 1825, by Mr. Sams, and was sold by Mr. Evans at a sale of curious books which that gentleman had collected. It was there purchased by Mr. Thorpe for 23*l.* 10*s.* The copy of the second edition belonged to the poet Waller, whose initials are in the title page. It was sold by Mr. Thorpe to Mr. Heber for 25*l.*, and at his sale, last year, came into this collection for the sum of 11*l.* 15*s.*

This edition is of scarcely less rarity than the preceding. It had not been seen by Don Joze Maria de Souza-Botelho, and evidently was unknown to Mons. Mablin. It was published by Manoel de Lyra, the printer, from whose office the other editions are stated to have issued, and the editor has followed the second edition as to the two last lines of the first stanza, except that the seventh line commences with the word Entre. In the title page is a handsome printer's device, placed between the title, and the account of the licenses, &c. representing Apollo playing upon a violin, by the music of which, he appears to charm a lion and a stag, the heads of which are given, one on each side of his feet, looking up as if listening to the sound. The motto, *Non vi sed ingenio et arte*, is round the upper part of the device. There is also a second device, richer than the first, following the table of contents, the same figure is given, but in a richer border, in which is a recumbent figure of Diana, and a stag at the top. The fact of annotations accompanying this edition, is at variance with the assertions that Manoel Correa was the first commentator on the Lusiad.

Between the end of the title and the imprint is a wood cut, within which is a tree, and the words MIHI TAXUS. The tree and this inscription are within a half circle, and at each side is a female figure, the one of Peace and the other of Truth. The licence is dated 30 December, 1595, from Philip II., of Spain, to Esteuaõ Lopez.

This extremely rare volume was purchased of Mr. Thorpe for 14*l.* 14*s.*, and is supposed to be the same copy as was sold at Mr. Evans' sale-room in 1825 amongst the curious books brought from Spain by Mr. Sams.

It is very remarkable that two editions of the Rimas were published of this date. The title as to the reading is the same, the type, however, being different. In the one is a device in the title page of a globe, with an inscription upon it, IN DEO. In the other, the device is the Royal Arms of Portugal. The licences and alvaras are the same, but the letter is in quite different characters. In the one the prologue is signed Domingos Fernandez, and in the other, it has no signature. The contents appear to be the same, the type varying considerably in various places. Both editions are in this collection and are rare.

Machado writes, "This poem (the Lusiad) was illustrated with learned notes by different authors, Manoel Correa, Licentiate in the sacred Canons, &c., a great friend of Camoens, being the first; whose work Pedro de Mariz published in Lisbon, from the press of Pedro Craesbeeck, 1613, and added to it some notes." The fact of notes being given in the Edition of 1584, is at variance with the above assertion.

The stores of Mr. Heber, and other collectors, were liberally placed at the disposal of the author, and Don Joze Maria de Souza-Botelho, the editor of the celebrated edition of the Lusiad, evinced the most lively interest for the success of the undertaking. These volumes contain the life of the Portuguese poet, with memoirs of his writings ; a bibliographical account of the several translations of the Lusiad, with notices concerning the translators ; and as accurate a list of the editions of the various works of Camoens as the author had the means to procure. The second volume contains also a translation of the Essay prefixed to Don Joze de Souza-Betelho's edition of the Lusiad. For this work Mr. Adamson was elected a Corresponding Member of the Royal Academy of Sciences at Lisbon. An illustrated copy is in the possession of the author, on which infinite pains have been bestowed. The whole is inlaid, so as to form two magnificent volumes, in folio, illustrated with nearly three hundred engravings and drawings, procured at a very considerable expense, and from all parts of the continent. A case, containing various documents, correspondence, medals, &c., relative to Camoens, is so made as to appear as a third volume. The work is bound in green morocco, and forms as fine a set of books of this description as can be met with. The author intends this copy to remain in his family.

For his publication of the Commentaries he was accused before the Inquisition of Castile, by D. Agostinho Manoel de Vasconcellos of maintaining opinions inimical to Catholicism. The charge was dismissed by the Holy Office as calumnious and groundless. The malice of D. Agostinho, however, still pursued him, who, joining

with two others to whom he had given offence, obtained an injunction to prevent the sale of the work until the affair was investigated before the Inquisition at Lisbon, upon a memorial presented by them. Several persons of distinction stood forward in his cause, and he was ordered to defend the passages complained of, which he did satisfactorily by the above productions.

The poem relates the misfortunes of two persons who, after having
been united in India, were shipwrecked on their return on the
coasts of Africa, where they wandered destitute until death put

an end to their sufferings. Their children also perished with their unhappy parents. The misfortunes of Leanor de Sa are as touching as those of Ignez de Castro, but they are less known and celebrated.

This distinguished poet, who was also celebrated for his skill in music and painting, was cotemporary with Camoens; his poem, on the siege of Diu, being published only two years after the appearance of the Lusiad. He was of illustrious ancestry, and highly distinguished himself in Africa and afterwards in Asia, where he commanded an armament in 1571. Returning home he retired to his estate near Evora. He is noticed by all the writers on Portuguese Poetry. The second of the above works was esteemed by its author as the best of his compositions, and was published, with a dedication to the Duke of Braganza, in 1594, by his son-in-law Antonio de Souza.

He was born at Lisbon in 1571, studied at Coimbra, and rose to the highest legal stations. He was universally beloved for his affable and obliging manners, and his great legal knowledge. He died in 1632. Amongst others who have been loud in his praise Lope de Vega composed a sonnet on the above poem. The first edition was published in Lisbon by Lourenço Crasbeeck in 1636, 4to.

He afterwards filled many important situations, and visited England as the Secretary to the Embassy in 1641, where he defended the title of his master to the Portuguese Throne. He was afterwards Ambassador to Holland, and on his return was made Secretary of State.— Amidst all the duties of these offices he found time to write in almost every department of Literature. He died in 1682.

The discovery, which this poem celebrates, was made by Diogo Alvarez Correa in the middle of the 16th Century. It is the first Epic poem composed in Brazil.

DE SA DE MIRANDA, DR. FRANCISCO. As Obras, 8vo. *Lisboa 1804*

This poet preceded Camoens about thirty years, the language up to his time had been rude and uncultivated, the necessity of refinement being superseded by the prevailing practice of the times, the Latin being considered the language of poetry in Portugal. This custom, much to his honour, he opposed and overcame. He was born at Coimbra 1495, and, leaving the university with the degree of Doctor of Laws, commenced Lecturer. He visited most of the cities of Europe, and retired, disappointed, to his Quinta, near Ponte de Lima, where he passed the remainder of his life. His works consist of sonnets, elegies, redondilhas, and two comedies. They were first printed at Lisbon by Manoel de Lyra, in 4to., 1595. The comedies had been printed some years previously, and were frequently acted before the Cardinal Dom Henrique.

FERREIRA, DR. ANTONIO. Poemas Lusitanos, 2 vol., 8vo. *Lisboa 1771*

This is the second edition, and contains, besides a life of the author, the tragedy of Castro, and the two comedies.

Ferreira was born at Lisbon in 1528, and was placed at the University of Coimbra, under Diogo de Teive, the friend of Buchanan, and afterwards became a Judge. He followed the plan of Sa de Mi-

randa, and wrote in the vernacular language. His writings embrace almost every species of minor poetical composition ; Castro, a tragedy founded on the story of Dona Ignez de Castro ; and two comedies. In his tragedy he is said to have taken Trissino for his model, whose Sophonisba was the first tragedy of modern times. Diogo Bernardes wrote a beautiful sonnet, complimenting him upon its composition. The poems were first printed in 1598, by Pedro Crasbeeck. The comedies were printed with those of Miranda, 4to., 1622.

Bernardes was a native of Ponte de Lima, and is called by Machado the Prince of Pastoral Poetry. Mr. Southey also has named him as one of the best of the Portuguese poets, and as being passionately fond of the scenery of the river Lyma. When Sebastian meditated the conquest of Africa, he selected Bernardes as the poet who should accompany him, and record, in a heroic poem, the victories and deeds of valour by which the conquest was to be ensured. He was taken prisoner, and, in beautiful language, contrasts his then state with his former happiness. He obtained his liberty, and died at Lisbon in 1596. He is accused of giving some of the sonnets of Camoens as his own productions. His work "O Lyma" was first published from the press of Simão Lopes, at Lisbon, 4to., 1596. The "Rimas varias" from that of Manoel de Lyra, 8vo., 1597, and the third work was printed by Pedro Crasbeeck, at Lisbon, in 8vo., in 1616.

Agostinho Bernardes was the brother of Diogo. Having considerable talent he was placed in the household of D. Duarte, the son of the

Infante Don Duarte. He afterwards adopted the austere habit of Saõ Francisco da Provincia da Arrabida, and was admitted at the convent of Santa Cruz, on the rock of Cintra, in 1561, whence he took his name. He obtained leave and became a hermit of the Arrabida, where he existed for fourteen years.

Filinto Elycio was the name taken by this celebrated Portuguese poet on his joining the Arcadian Society. He had two narrow escapes for his life; first at the time of the great earthquake, and afterwards from the officers of the Inquisition, to which tribunal he was about to be carried in consequence of being accused of too liberal principles. He escaped almost miraculously to France, where he passed the rest of his life in exile. He was eminently

skilled in various departments of knowledge, and thoroughly acquainted with the modern languages of Europe, which he had diligently studied. He was the intimate associate of the poet Garcaõ, whose fate it was, like his, to be unfortunate. A full account of his life and adventures is given by Sané in the second of the above works.

A modern and justly celebrated poet of Portugal. Uniting the warrior with the bard he has embodied with energy the images which the circumstances in which he was placed called before him, and has left behind him an imperishable reputation. Having landed in India he visited the coast of China, and at Macaõ subjected himself to the same fate which befel Camoens. Having like him held up to ridicule the authorities of the place he was exiled, and returning home, died at Lisbon at the early age of 35. His works consist of Sonnets, Odes, Epistles, and all the other minor compositions.

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

SERMONS.

VIEIRA, P. ANTONIO. Sermoens do P. Antonio Vieira da Companhia de Jesus, Pregador da sua Alteza.— 4to. 12 tomos. *Lisboa 1679—1699*

This author was born at Lisbon, 6th Feb., 1608, and very early evinced the splendid talents with which he was naturally endowed, and which afterwards, by cultivation, raised him to the highest

fame, not only amongst his countrymen, but throughout the civilized world. At the age of seven years he embarked with his parents for Bahia, and afterwards joined the Company of Jesus. It would far exceed the limits of this note to give any thing like a sketch of the career of this celebrated man. His life has been written by the father Andre de Barros, and is in this Collection.—A translation of that work, with a good account of his writings, would be well received. He was one of a deputation sent to Europe to congratulate Joaõ the IV. on his accession, and was received with great affection by that monarch, who subsequently employed him in various negociations at different Courts, which he conducted with great success, corresponding with the King. He was esteemed the greatest preacher of the age, and was highly esteemed, more particularly at Rome, where he gave some discourses in the presence of Christina, Queen of Sweden. He returned to Maranhaõ, in 1652, to convert the Indians, an object which he had had in view for many years. He was obliged to re-visit Portugal to obtain some alleviation from their condition of slavery as a first step, and having succeeded, he accompanied a new Governor out. His exertions were excessive and he spared no pains in endeavouring to accomplish this favourite object; voyaging, and traversing on foot, and bearing every description of fatigue and annoyace from the difficulties he had to encounter, as well from the climate as other causes. He translated the catechism into the languages, and built various churches. The fruits of his labour were abundant, and numbers were converted. He was subject to many persecutions and vexations during a long and useful life, and his last years were spent in Bahia, where, retired in his Quinta, he occupied himself in preparing his various works for publication. He died 18th July, 1697, aged 89 years. Besides the sermons, he left several other works.
