April 3^d 1811.

First Positions.

- A. The second corps of the French Army under Genl Reynier in position on the right bank of the River Coa at Sabugal.
- a. French outposts on the left bank of the Coa.
- B. Part of the 6th Corps of the French Army at Evonka.
- C. The Light Division and the Cavalry of the Allied Army, under M. G. de Brokne and M. G. Stale.
- D. The 3rd Division under M. Genl Pictet.
- c. Two Brigades of Artillery detached from the 3rd Division.
- E. The 5th Division under M. Genl Durstop.
- F. The 6th Division under M. G. Alex^r Campbell at Martin de Paga.
- f. A battalion of the 6th Division in advance at Tapala de Coa.

- G. Line of march of the Cavalry of the Allies.
- H. Line of march of the Light Division.
- I. Attack of the Light Division.
- J. Line of march of the 3rd Division.
- i. Line of March of two Brigades of Artillery detached from the 3rd Division and escorted by a battalion from the 5th Division.
- K. Line of march of the 5th Division.
- k. The Light Troops of the 5th Division passing the Coa after having driven back the French Out Posts.
- m. Movement made by the Left and Centre of the French to oppose the attack of the Light Division.
- n. Lines of retreat of the French after the action.
- D. Part of the 6th French Corps in march from Evonka to support the 2nd Corps.
- P. The 1st Division of the Allied Army arriving from Serdara.
- P.S. The Plan does not extend sufficiently to show the 7th Division which was in march following the 1st.
